Plus there are multiple meeting and recreational rooms for nurses to network, exchange ideas and practices plus enjoy time with other professionals.

2025 Master's and Degree Level Education Modules

We have partnered with De Montfort University for over ten years, providing accredited modules leading to qualifications at degree and master's level.

Principles and Practice of Stoma Care Module (Degree and Master's levels)

In collaboration with De Montfort University, this module dives into every facet of adult stoma care, from preparation for surgery to long-term management. With two pathways tailored for those aiming for Level 6 (Degree) or Level 7 (Master's), participants will be supported in crafting engaging oral presentations and written assignments. Hands-on workshops, real-world case studies, and expert-led sessions by well-respected clinicians will elevate your own clinical practice.

This fast-paced, interactive module is designed to develop advanced skills, knowledge and expertise in stoma care. It has been designed to allow nurses working in stoma care to build upon their previous physiological, psychological and social knowledge base. To facilitate the development of professional critical analysis/synthesis, reflective and thinking skills.

PCPH 5020 Level 7 – (30 credits/Master level)

Entry requirements. Applicants are required to:

- Have attained a degree at 2:2 level or above (PCPH 5020 level 7 only)
- Attend all six formal study days as details below
- Deliver a 10 minute presentation to peers
- Produce a 3000 word assignment

PCPH 3020 Level 6 - (30 credits/Degree level)

Entry requirements. Applicants are required to:

- Be postgraduate nurses studying to degree level
- Attend all six formal study days as details below
- Deliver a 10 minute presentation to peers
- Produce a 3000 word assignment

Please note: this module is run in conjunction with De Montfort University and hosted by Salts Healthcare within our Salts Academy in Birmingham. As such we will share your personal details with the university in order to enrol you on the module.

Level 7 Master's learning outcomes:

- Review the anatomy and physiology of the gastrointestinal tract / urinary tract and related organs.
- Apply professional knowledge and skills to critically assess and synthesise the planning, management and evaluation of a holistic patient assessment.
- Critically examine with key themes encompassing principles of care for the patient, who is to undergo the formation of a stoma utilising individualsed and appropriate interventions both in hospital and in the community from admission to discharge.
- Critically review and synthesise key issues that relate to the concepts of health, rehabilitation and adaption in the concept of stoma forming surgery including pre, peri, post-operative, rehabilitative management and education of the new ostomist.
- Apply professional knowledge and skills to critically analyse and synthesise physical, social and psychological problems that the ostomist may have including fistulae formation, sexual dysfunction, changes to body image.
- Critically analyse professional issues related to stoma care including the principles of multidisciplinary team work, pharmacological care and current professional nursing agenda.

(The learning outcomes for level 6 are very similar but reflect degree level learning skill.)

2025 Master's and Degree Level Education Courses

We have partnered with Birmingham City University for five years, providing modules leading to qualifications at degree and master's level.

Fundamentals of Children's Stoma Care and Continence Management Module (Degree and Master's levels)

In collaboration with Birmingham City University this unique, accredited module explores caring for a baby and/or child with a stoma or continence issue. The module highlights the distinctive needs of an individual with a stoma as they age from neonate, baby, child through to adolescence, along with exploring the needs of immediate care givers/parents and their role within this journey.

LBR7463 Level 7 - (20 credits/Master level)

Entry requirements. Applicants are required to:

- Be a postgraduate nurse working with children with a stoma
- Have attained a degree at 2:2 level or above
- Complete a 500 word critique of an article
- Attend all six formal study days as details below
- Produce a portfolio of practice-based learning including reflection and a critical analysis

LBR6511 Level 6 – (20 credits/Degree level)

Entry requirements. Applicants are required to:

- Be postgraduate nurses working and have regular access to children
- Attend all six formal study days as details below
- Produce a portfolio of practice-based learning including reflection and a critical analysis

Please note: this course is run in conjunction with Birmingham City University and hosted by Salts Healthcare within our Salts Academy in Birmingham. As such we will share your personal details with the university in order to enrol you on the module.

Small bowel transplantation, ACE, Urodynamics and Mitrofanoff, along with Inflammatory Bowel Disease in childhood are just a few of the specialist topics that will be taught by clinical experts from Birmingham Children's Hospital.

The legal and ethical considerations will be examined, as well as reviewing the special needs of children living with a stoma when they go to school.

Level 7 Master's learning outcomes:

- Critically review and translate current practice guidelines and research to assess the needs of the patient and their family.
- Appraise current practice guidelines and research to critically reflect on your delivery of holistic care.
- Critically evaluate the legal and ethical issues associated with the patient and their family to support them and to meet their specific needs.
- Justify evidence-based resources which support health and well-being and prevent adverse effects for patients, and their families.

Back to Basics study day (CPD Accredited)

Who this day is suitable for:

An extremely popular education event for ward based nurses, HCAs and carers keen to learn more about the basics of providing quality stoma care. Attendees will have the opportunity to learn and practice the fundamentals in managing a stoma and supporting their patients in the first few days after surgery.

Siting workshop (CPD Accredited)

Who this day is suitable for:

This is an interactive workshop for registered nurses who site as part of their clinical role. We emphasise active learning, which provides practical, hands-on experience in stoma siting. The workshop includes practical exercises, case studies, and interactive learning to equip nurses with the skills to confidently site stomas for patients of diverse needs and body types.

Learning objectives:

- Understand the Role of the Specialist Stoma Care Nurse: Gain a clear understanding of the specialist stoma care nurse's responsibilities in preparing patients for surgical procedures that may result in stoma formation.
- Importance of Pre-surgical Patient Preparation: Recognise the significance of thorough patient preparation prior to elective surgery with potential stoma formation.
- Master Abdominal Assessment: Learn how to assess the abdomen to determine the optimal stoma site for improved patient outcomes.
- Patient Advocacy in Stoma Marking: Develop skills and knowledge to advocate for patients by ensuring accurate marking of the abdomen for temporary or permanent stomas.
- Consider Lifestyle Factors: Understand the critical role of discussing lifestyle factors with patients before siting a stoma to tailor care to their individual needs.
- Understand Legal Implications: Explore the legal and professional responsibilities and consequences of inadequate patient preparation in stoma formation and care.

Antegrade Continent Enema (ACE) study day

This one day study day focuses on how to care for an individual who is living with a Antegrade Continent Enema (ACE). Exploring some of the challenges faced by some patients and understand the variety of irrigation methods that can help to optimise quality of life for patients living with an ACE.

Learning objectives:

- Understand the ACE Procedure: Develop a comprehensive understanding of the Antegrade Continence Enema (ACE) procedure, including surgical formation using the appendix or bowel and its role in managing constipation and faecal leakage.
- **Pre- and Post-operative Care:** Learn the key steps in preparing for and managing post-operative care following an ACE procedure, including wound care and patient recovery.
- Home-based Irrigation Techniques: Acquire knowledge on administering ACE irrigation at home, including using catheters, enema solutions, and irrigation bags, to help caregivers support patients effectively.
- Troubleshooting Complications: Understand common post-operative and long-term complications associated with ACE, such as stoma closure, bowel response issues, and minor leakage, along with strategies for prevention and resolution.
- Customising Irrigation Schedules: Learn to assist patients in developing a personalised irrigation routine based on individual bowel response, helping to optimise the results of the ACE procedure for improved quality of life.
- Supporting Patient Independence: Gain skills to educate and empower children and their caregivers to independently manage the ACE procedure, focusing on safe and effective home care and catheter use.

Advanced Paediatric study day

This study day equips specialist stoma care nurses with knowledge and skills for managing paediatric stoma patients. It covers essential areas, including understanding paediatric-specific pathologies, the unique characteristics of neonatal skin, and the application of evidence-based stoma care practices. Nurses will also learn to recognise and manage complications, including peristomal skin breakdown and post-stoma closure care. Additionally, the day will explore product selection tailored to the needs of paediatric patients and emphasises holistic care, ensuring both the child and their family receive comprehensive emotional and physical support throughout the stoma care journey.

- **Product Selection and Usage:** Gain expertise in the appropriate use of paediatric stoma care products and accessories, tailoring care to the specific needs of neonates and children.
- Holistic Patient and Family Care: Understand the emotional, physical, and educational support required for both the child and their family, promoting holistic care throughout the stoma journey.

Counselling Skills for Healthcare Professionals

CPD Workshop (Person-Centred Approach)

This 2-day workshop equips stoma nurses with essential counselling and communication skills based on the Person-Centred Approach. Through a mix of theory, practical exercises, and reflective practice, participants will develop the skills to engage in compassionate, empathetic, and effective patient care. Key areas include active listening, ethical decision-making, self-awareness, and strategies for managing challenging conversations. The workshop fosters deeper patient connections and builds emotional resilience, leading to improved care outcomes

Who this day is suitable for:

Nurses working within the specialist sphere of stoma care.

Learning objectives:

- Understand the Principles of Person-Centred Counselling: Gain a solid understanding of the core values of person-centred counselling, including individuality, independence, and respect, and their relevance in stoma care.
- Create a Non-Judgmental Environment: Learn techniques to foster a supportive, non-judgmental space where patients feel comfortable exploring their experiences and emotions.
- Utilise Empathy in Counselling: Develop skills to empathetically understand patients' feelings, promoting openness and trust in counselling sessions.
- Support Client-Led Conversations: Encourage patients to guide their own counselling sessions, helping them take ownership of their emotional and physical journey with stoma care.
- Apply Congruence in Practice: Understand the importance of congruence, ensuring that your actions and behaviour as a stoma care professional align authentically with your feelings and professional role.

Motivational interviewing Training

Motivational interviewing focuses on exploring and resolving uncertainty and centres on motivational processes within the individual that facilitate change. It is often defined as a collaborative conversation to strengthen a person's own motivation for, and commitment to change. This 2-day workshop is designed to enhance your knowledge and improve your skills around Motivational Interviewing.

Who this day is suitable for:

Specialist Stoma care nurses working within the specialist sphere of stoma care. This 2-day workshop is designed to enhance your knowledge and improve your skills around Motivational Interviewing.

Learning objectives:

- **Define MI:** identifying the theoretical background, core principles and models used for this technique in stoma nursing.
- Gain an insight into MI techniques: Critically evaluate how the application of MI techniques assists the SSCN in their role.
- Ostomy care: Critically reviews, develops and applies principles of MI for the ostomate to actively support the individual with changes to their lifestyle following stomatom
- Communication Skills: Critically reflect upon the importance of being an engaging, attentive, active and reflective listener to assist the ostomate on their life's journey.
